Recipient	In general: Any unbaptized person In Particular: Infants or persons not yet at the age of reason. Adults and those of the age of reason who desire baptism and are properly disposed.	Roman rite: Baptized persons not yet confirmed are of age of reason and wish to be confirmed.	Baptized persons in the state of grace who are of the age of reason, believe in the Real Presence, and are properly disposed.
Essentials Of The Rite	Pouring of water or immersion into water with the words: “(Name), I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.”	Laying on of the hand and anointing with chrism on the forehead with the words: “(Name) be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.”	Changing bread and wine into the Body & Blood of Christ by the words: “Take this, all of you, and eat it: this is my body which will be given up for you....Take this and drink from it: this is the cup of my blood of the new & everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.”

Enables one to be more like Christ the Priest, Prophet, & King. 4. Empowers one to witness to Christ courageously. 5. Strengthens one to serve others and to share the faith with them. 6. Deepens our union with Christ & through Him with Father & the Holy Spirit & with all the members of the Christ. 3. Obtains forgiveness of venial sin & enables one to reach out in forgiveness to others. 4. Increases love for other people, impelling one to serve them & to share the gospels with them.

Baptized persons who have committed sin & are sincerely sorry for having offended God	Baptized persons whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age. Contrition, confession, act of penance, plus the words of absolution: "God the Father of mercies, through the death & resurrection of His Son has reconciled the world to Himself & sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins; through the ministry of the Church may God give you pardon & peace, & I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, & of the Son, & of the Holy Spirit."	Anointing of the forehead & hands with the oil of the sick & the prayer: "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in His love & mercy help you, with the grace of the Holy Spirit. Amen" "May the Lord who frees you from sin save you & raise you up. Amen"	The marriage covenant of the bride & groom consenting to give themselves permanently to each other in the presence of the priest (deacon) and the Church community.	Laying on hands and the words of the consecrating prayer.

Confers the special powers of the order received, the diaconship, the priesthood, or the episcopate 3. Indelibly marks the person. 4. Gives special graces, enabling the recipient to lead, teach, and sanctify the people.

Priest: be a spiritual leader, celebrate the Eucharist, forgive sins, celebrate other sacraments preach. 3. Bishop: provide pastoral teaching, fulfill priestly duties, ordain priests, lead diocese.
